**2004** German maestro, Wolfgang Feld retires from an illustrious course-designing career. Twenty-five years and three Olympic gold medals after his last four-star win at Burghley, Andrew Hoy produces an outstanding display of horsemanship on Moonflirt in hot, humid conditions. But his achievement is overshadowed by the death of poplar British squad member, Caroline Pratt.



**2008** Experience shows as wet weather takes its toll: William equals Ginny Elliot and Mark Todd's quintets of wins aboard the exuberant Tamarillo and, for good measure, finishes second on Ballincoola. Mary King is third and fourth on Imperial Cavalier and Apache Sauce. The Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials was the only televised sporting event to take place this weekend. Burghley celebrates an unprecedented fifth 'Best Event' award by L'Annee Hippique.

**2010** Caroline Powell secures her place in history as the first female Kiwi to win a four-star; her bouncy little grey mount, Lenamore, breaks records too — at 17, he is Burghley's oldest equine winner and, at 15.2h, one of the smallest. Oh, and Mark Todd is back...

**2003** An unforgettable Event in Bill Henson's last year as Director. Pippa Funnell achieves the Rolex Grand Slam after a season of almost unbearable tension, triumphing in a cliff-hanger with Zara Phillips making her Burghley debut on Toytown. Pippa's achievement may never be matched.

**2007** William Fox-Pitt notches up win number four on Parkmore Ed.

**2005** Land Rover become title sponsor — a partnership still going strong today.



**2005** Liz Inman becomes the first female director of a four-star event, Mark Phillips returns to design the course, which by now is benefiting from investment in an irrigation system and fencing-off from stock. William Fox-Pitt notches up victory number three on Ballincoola and makes history as the last rider to win a long-format Burghley; 2006 sees the last Roads & Tracks and Steeplechase before the Sport universally moves over to short-format.

**2009** Oliver Townend joins the elite band of riders to have done the Badminton-Burghley double in the same 12 months, with a win on Carousel Quest. Miranda Rock takes over from her mother as Burghley President.



**2011** Burghley's golden jubilee, which is expected to attract a crowd of 160,000-plus.
