nine horses in total finished with cross-country penalties added to their tally, including Tina Cook's De Novo News, who said no on his first approach to the Stonar School Cabins at fence 3, and Louisa Lockwood's Ballyferris Flight, who did the same a few fences later at the Smith & Williamson Offset.

A winning Brucester

Oliver Townend made sure that at least one Gatcombe Trophy went to his Ellesmere home, Brucester Rooster giving him a Novice Championship victory after he finished on his competitive dressage score of 29.6.


This left Andrew Nicholson and the mare Omeya, who only commenced her eventing career this season, trailing in second and China's Alex Hua Tian, who was shadowed by a TV crew throughout Gatcombe, in third with Furst Love.

The Irish-bred Brucester came via Vere Phillipps.

"I saw him looking over the stable door and said to Vere: 'I







wouldn't bother with that one.' He told me I was making a mistake," said Oliver, recalling his first meeting with the gelding who had then only been broken and lightly jumped. "He was definitely jumpt. I realised that as soon as I sat on him. He's one of the nicest horses I've ever ridden, with a reality trainable brain."

Ruth Edge, previously a queen of Gatcombe, suffered a disastrous Novice Championships. Having occupied first and second place following the dressage with Mister Maccondy and Bojack JX, she withdrew the former after rolling three show jumps, while the latter was eliminated for a horse fall at the very last cross-country fence.

Third-placed Sarah Bullimore withdrew Reve Du Rouet after another hefty show jumping score, while Kitty King and Zidante, fourth after the dressage, pulled up at fence 11 following two refusals.

The Kiwi benefit theme had begun on Saturday when Andrew Nicholson scooped both advanced sections, with Calico Joe and Quimbo. The latter is owned, like Andrew's British Open winner Nereo, by Libby Sellar and he was notching up his third victory of the season.

"He's won a lot for an eightyear-old," said the jockey who felt that his other winner, Calico Joe, had turned a corner over the coloured poles.

"He's a good dressage horse and he's very fast across country but the show jumping used to be his weak link. This season, though, he's been jumping so much better. I think he could be a classy horse."
