OLIVER TOWNEND took over the mantle of "Mr Weston Park". He won both advanced sections when, for the first in 10 years, Andrew Nicholson went away without an advanced section in the bag.

But Andrew did pick up a third (Mr Cruise Control) and a seventh (Viscount George).

Oliver's first win came with Douglas, who was bought last year by Harthill Stud from Emilie Chandler.

"I've always liked him as a horse and, although in theory everything is for sale, this horse feels like the real deal," said Oliver of the VDL Ard Douglas 10-year-old.

"This is a fantastic place and riding a good horse round here is as good as anywhere. They need to be good over a fence as the showjumping always takes a bit of jumping, with broomstick poles and being close to the crosscountry, but mine all jumped clear

"The cross-country was good as ever - decent with loads of questions," he added. "I thought the double of corners at 14ab was bordering on a four-star test, but they rode well."

Plenty took a flag with them here, although the ride of the day through it had to be fourth-placed William Fox-Pitt and Chilli Morning. They were foot perfect, despite there being no flag to hold them in after a previous competitor had knocked it.

Oliver's second advanced winner Outside Chance is another relatively new ride. He took over on the 10-year-old last July when the horse's owner Angela Hislop sent her entire string to him.

"Like Douglas, he is a very classy horse and very careful, which is great as you can always keep riding forward," said Oliver.
