OLIVER TOWNEND made his first visit to Burgham a winning one, taking the top two places in the advanced with Neo Du Breuil and

Imperial Master.

Andrew Cawthray's 12-year-old gelding pipped his stablemate to victory by 4.4 faults, having added just 0.8 time-penalties to his dressage score of 32.3.

"I'm really glad I came," said Oliver, who is aiming the grey gelding for Blenheim. "It was a good to strong cross-country and definitely did its job."

His second-placed ride Imperial Master, owned by Val Ryan, was the only horse inside the time in this section, the wily 15-year-old enjoying his spin around Northumberland.

"I try to take him to places he doesn't know as he's less likely to nap," said Oliver.

The Master Imp gelding won the CIC3* at Ballindenisk last year and, with a £50,000 bonus on offer, Oliver is hoping to contest the CCI3* this season.

Caroline Powell took third with Alan Bell's Thornfield Jones, who added 7.2 time-faults to his dressage of 32.1.

"It was a good attacking track, with a lot of questions in quick succession," said Caroline, "We've had a few ups and downs over the past few competitions, so this was pleasing.

Melody's surprise win

WILLS OAKDEN and the 10-yearold Greystone Midnight Melody



won the open intermediate. adding nothing to their leading dressage score of 27.3.

'That was a bit of a surprise," said Wills. "She bucked in the medium canter!'

Owned by David Kenwright, the 10-year-old mare has only rolled one pole all season and didn't add to that tally here.

"She's such a consistent showjumper and she cruised round the cross-country," said Wills

He was also fourth with McFly, whose owner Nicola Malcolm couldn't be there to watch as she was getting married.

Second went to James

Sommerville and nine-year-old Angel Eyes, owned by Ann Stead.

"Hopefully, this will cheer her up as she has been quite poorly," said James, who kept a clean sheet to finish on his dressage of 33.2

'She's always quick on the cross-country. She's a super mare who loves her job," he said.

Anna Warnecke topped the competitive intermediate section with Ghareeb King, adding 2.4 time-penalties to finish on 33.3.

'I'm extremely pleased," said Anna, who is still recovering from a broken arm sustained at Houghton. "The season didn't go to plan; I had hoped he would be competing at three-star by now.

Praise for Burgham

PLENTY of riders praised the event and the organising team, in particular riders Martyn Johnson and Craig Anderson, who have been instrumental in keeping the event going.

"They've put in an unbelievable amount of effort to get it right," said Oliver Townend. "The dressage arenas are fantastic, the showjumping was a decent track and the crosscountry courses were spot on. They deserve full credit and a lot more competitors in future."

eye-catching liver chestnut Zippo. "I'm really chuffed, it was a nice round as our last run before the CCI2* at Blair," said Emily, who

finished on her dressage of 35.5. "He has been quite feisty this year in the dressage, but he was

calm and much improved here." Third were the programme cover stars, Emma Carmichael and her own eight-year-old Cooley Lucky Strike, who picked up 3.2 time-faults for going too fast.
