TRICKY FENCE



ONE of the most influential fences on the CIC2* track came quite early on. This was at fences five and six two brush corners approached on a downhill turn overlooking the River Tweed

early on in the course after three straightforward fences, although there was a kind alternative," said Oliver Townend. He led after showiumping

with Colonel Joe but a win evaporated here after a run-out at fence six "It was a babyish mistake

and I'll forgive him - he needs more mileage," added Oliver.
