OLIVER TOWNEND may have ended Irish domination of their premier event, but none of the appreciative crowd at Tattersalls begrudged him his convincing win there in the sixth leg of the HSBC FEI World Cup on Henry and Edna Harding's Ashdale Cruise Master.

Just five weeks after the pair's painful fall at Kentucky was beamed around the world, Oliver gave the latest addition to his line-up of grey stars an admirably positive ride to lead from the off. 'It's what I came to do and I now

hope that'll be the end of the fall talk," said Oliver. "We're still a relatively new partnership and I

haven't quite sorted the bitting, but I'm thrilled with the horse. He's had a lot to cope with and has changed hugely, both mentally and physically."

Mary King was masterful in second throughout on Apache Sauce, who rose above his occasional tendency to be cheekily headstrong

He was so silly at Belton and Chatsworth that I withdrew, but he was on his best behaviour here," said Mary, who blamed herself for unbalancing him before the last showjump, which he had down.

Michael Ryan, runner-up in 2009, was best of the home side and, for the second year running, produced a beautiful showjumping round - the only totally clear one, as it turned out, for Oliver had two time-faults.
