Ireland's Sarah Ennis split two-day training session with Gemma's rides in the three-star to

finish second on a combined score of 52.4 with her 2014 Chatsworth winner, Horseware Stellor Rebound, However, it was a distinctly different Stellor Rebound that Sarah found herself sitting on at Burgham, which she admitted was lovely, if slightly

unexpected. "He's usually a total terrorist and we had major braking issues at Chatsworth and WEG last year, but it was like butter wouldn't melt in his mouth today," admitted a

bemused Sarah, "He was much calmer and really seems to have grown up." She was quick to credit the influence of a recent

Christopher Bartle.

"The man is a genius," she stated emphatically. "He helps so many people and I honestly don't know where he gets his energy from."

sixth respectively, and will run at Burnham Market before scheduled assaults on Kentucky and Badminton.

"It feels fantastic to be back and I cannot thank enough the numerous people who have supported and helped get me here," said Nicola, with her

trademark smile firmly in place. "I ran them all in the two-star as this is our first run out and is the equivalent of our initial OI really, she continued. "They're all well on in their fitness, but there were some good galloping runs on the course so it was a good test forthem.

"This was Annie Clover's first run since WEG, which was a big challenge for her so I'm delighted she's come out so well," said Nicola. "I've dropped her down from a gag to a snaffle which she seems really happy in - she was having a lovely time though and I definitely had a double handful towards the end of the track."

Oliver Townend was third with Andrew Cawthray's Note Worthy, a horse back in his yard after being campaigned by Tim Boland last year.

"It was a great result for him against much more experienced horses," said Oliver.

Angus Smales headed the relatively small OI section with Diana Birch's A Bit Much. The fastest cross-country round of the class elevated them up the leaderboard after the pair added four showiumping penalties to a dressage score of 33.4. Julie Lawson and her working stallion Primitive Faerie Tale were second on 43.2, with Paul Tapner and Pioneer Milly third.

Local rider Jessica McKie, daughter of former champion jockey lan McKie and a point-topoint trainer in her own right, snatched victory in the intermediate section from Wills Oakden by posting a faster

cross-country time. She piloted Ask The Boss home for just 6.4 time-penalties compared to Will's and Chiara D's 7.6. Sam Ecroyd, a 2010 pony team gold medallist, was third

with Tullaher Sunrise. H&H
