BRITISH OPEN INCORPORATING THE EVENT RIDER MASTERS 1

Oliver Townend became the first British rider for five years to win The British Open Championship, with a brilliant piece of riding on the talented but quirky Cillnabradden Evo, owned by Sally-Anne Egginton. The competition, which incorporated the fourth leg of the new Event Rider Masters series, built to a thrilling climax as riders faulted under the pressure of the occasion and the lead rapidly changed hands.



Oliver adds this title to a total of two wins and five top five placings at Gatcombe over the weekend.

[It was Oliver's 96th international run over a 12 month period. EquiRatings are monitoring the rest of the season to see if Oliver will become the first event rider in history to break 100 international runs in a 12 month period.

BRITISH INTERMEDIATE CHAMPIONSHIP (2)

Alexander Whewall celebrated the biggest win of his career when he triumphed in the Smith & Williamson British Intermediate Championship. Somerset-based Alexander, who partnered Lisa Coward's Chakiris Star, turned in a dressage score of 29.7 before posting a foot-perfect double clear for just eight time penalties.

"He's only little and he's not flash, but he tries so hard. He was spot on in all three phases today; I couldn't fault him," added Alexander, who is 28 and keeps his string of 13 horses at his parents' yard near Bristol.
